 twenty Dollars one Bed & Furniture price twenty five Dollars and also
 to my said Daughter Jane I Give unto her one other Negro Girl named
 Caroline aged five years price four hundred Dollars
 Fourthly I Give unto my Son John M B Moore one Negro Boy named

 & Calves price twenty Dollars one Bed & Furniture price twenty five Dollars

 ten Dollars) Fifthly I Give unto my Son William A S Moore one
 Negro Boy named Thaddeus Price one hundred Dollars and Seventy five
 Dollars two Cows & Calves price twenty Dollars one Bed & Furniture price
 twenty five Dollars and I also Give unto my said Son William A S Moore
 one other Negro Girl named Almida aged 4 years Price two hundred
 Dollars and I also Give unto my said Son William one Set of Blacksmiths
 tools price ten Dollars.) Sixthly I Give unto my Daughter Mary
 Moore one Negro Girl named Amanda price three hundred Dollars
 one horse & Saddle price Seventy five Dollars two Cows & Calves price
 twenty Dollars one Bed & Furniture price twenty five Dollars
 Seventhly I Give unto my Daughter Rachel Moore one Negro Girl
 named Sophronia price three hundred Dollars one horse & Saddle
 price Seventy five Dollars two Cows & Calves price twenty Dollars one
 Bed & Furniture price twenty five Dollars and also to my said daughter
 Rachel I Give unto her one other Negro (boy) named Molly aged two
 years price two hundred and fifty Dollars

Rightly I give unto my Grand Children that is to say an Children of James Thomas and the Children of my daughter Nancy Thomas all the Children that she may have and all the Children she may have hereafter I give unto them one Negro Girl named Charity Price three hundred Dollars one horse & Saddle price Seventy five Dollars two Cows & Calves Price twenty Dollars one Bed & Furniture price twenty five Dollars and also to the said Grand Children as Express'd above I give unto them one Blind Mare price thirty Dollars and I also give unto them one tract of land Containing one hundred & twenty five acres more or less being half of lot Number (126) one hundred & twenty six third District, Madison County price Four hundred Dollars and if there is any thing at the close or Settlement of my Estate whatever it is I wish the said Grand Children to have their Equitable part) Monthly I give unto my Wife Phoebe Moore one Hundred Acres of land to be Surveyed out of the place where we now live including the House or Houses on the same adjoining Miller Boice & Whelley I also give unto my said Wife Phoebe Moore three Negroes to wit Moses a Man Francis a Girl & Aureus a Woman and three horses called Buckens two Cows & Calves one bed & Furniture and necessary house hold & Kitchen furniture Plantation Tools &c Monthly I desire that my two Negro Men Seabaum & Jerry & Negro Woman Phelis be sold out to the best advantage and the proceeds being together with the residue of my Estate both Real & Personal be applied in the discharge of debts & to or among my aforesaid Children Share and Share alike) Lastly I do hereby appoint my Wife Phoebe Moore & John M. Moore Executors to this my last Will and Testament; In Witness Whereof I have this 9th day of October 1840 Eighteen hundred & forty set my hand & Seal in Presence of
